RECENT GRANTS RECAPPED: \$49,000 Donated to Local Charities

JPFF is pleased to share that we've granted out \$49,000 over the past twelve months to the following Connecticut-based charities:

- **Circle of Care (\$5,000)** to support their Lifeline Emergency Fund, a financial assistance program aimed at alleviating some of the financial difficulties many families experience when their children are undergoing treatment for cancer.
- Connecticut Audubon Society Center at Fairfield JPFF Trailblazers program (\$11,000) - to fund the "JPFF Trailblazers Program," which enters its eighth year of existence and provides Bridgeport public school students with transportation to the Nature Center for science field trips. Since its inception, nearly 5,000 students have participated in the Trailblazers program.
- The Council of Churches of Greater Bridgeport's Janus Center (\$5,000) - to fund the Janus Center's Summer Enrichment Program which provides at-risk teens with a five-week summer program that exposes youth to various career choices, and engages them with educational and skill-building topics.
- Hall Neighborhood House (\$5,000) to support after-school programs for Bridgeport youth that emphasize positive character development through social and emotional learning.

High School Scholarship Foundation of Fairfield (\$2,000) - to fund the John Flanagan Memorial annual scholarship awarded to a collegebound, high-achieving student with an economic need at Fairfield Warde High School.

- LifeBridge Community Services (\$5,000) to support the Community Closet program which distributes basic needs items to over 2,500 families impacted by poverty. This grant also funds their School Supplies Project, which focuses on children's preparedness for school through the provision of basic items that students need to participate in classroom and homework activities such as pens, pencils, and notebooks).
- **Mikey's Way foundation (\$5,000)** to support the charity's mission to provide interactive, handheld electronics to sick children in the hospital as a way to escape the fear, boredom and isolation of their hospital beds. This is a small, local charity named in memory of 16 year-old Mikey Friedman, who also passed away in 2008.
- United in Hope Scholarship Fund (\$11,250) to provide college tuition assistance to high school graduates who have lost a parent to cancer. This scholarship is jointly supported by the Chad A. Jacobs Memorial Foundation.
- Wakeman Boys & Girls Club's Smilow-Burroughs Clubhouse in Bridgeport (\$5,000) - to support a new fitness and nutrition after-school program named FitFutures, that serves 150 members annually to educate them on healthy eating habits, improved physical activity and the positive effects healthy eating and exercise have on their well-being.

Wakeman's FitFutures Program was a huge success as shown by these great photos!

We were were thrilled to partner with the Bridgeport Hospital Foundation for a second time to build out a second children's lounge dedicated to John Flanagan -- this time at the Yale New Haven Health Park Avenue Medical Center.

The new John Patrick Flanagan Children's Corner is part of the outpatient surgery waiting room. It offers children who are there for outpatient surgery a place to play and meet with onsite counselors who help the children through the surgery process. It's also a place for non-patient children to play while waiting - often for many hours - for a family member to be discharged from outpatient

surgery.

Thank you to Steve Jakab, President of the Bridgeport Hospital Foundation, and the entire Bridgeport Hospital team for the opportunity to create this wonderful space in John's name.

FAIRFIELD WARDE HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED

Congratulations to JPFF's 2018 Fairfield Warde HS scholarship recipient **Amelia Sicignano**.

Amelia's school counselor wrote, "Amelia is one of the most disciplined students I have worked with in the time that I have been a counselor."

Amelia has also served as a volunteer for Special Olympics and the Bridgeport Rescue Mission, and is a member of the Warde Varsity Swim Team, the Chinese National Honors Society, the Science National Honors Society, the Key Club and the Kiva Club. She has received awards as a Connecticut Swimming Scholar Athlete, USA Swimming Winter Junior National Qualifier, and is the state record holder and member of the number one ranked 200 Medley relay for 15-16 year old girls in the United States.

In writing a letter of recommendation on her behalf, her English teacher has noted that Amelia "...is just one of those people whom one can count on to try her best, to be kind to others, to be self-motivated, and to be a role model."

Amelia will attend Emory University in the fall and plans to major in social work and pre-law.

Now in its 6th year, the United in Hope scholarship is jointly funded by The <u>Chad A. Jacobs Memorial Foundation</u> and the John Patrick Flanagan Foundation. THOUGHTS OF JOHN

John met two cherished friends, Jim O'Brien and Mike Renaud, while he was attending the University of Connecticut School of Law. Thank you Jim and Mike for sharing these touching memories with us all.

Background: While John attended law school at night in the mid-90's, he worked for current U.S. Senator Richard Blumenthal who was CT Attorney General at the time. So John was very was active in Democratic politics across the state. Fellow night school law student Jim O'Brien worked as an advisor to Republican Governor John Rowland. Despite their divergent political views, John and Jim became fast friends. At the time, current Attorney General George Jepsen was an up-and-coming Democratic Force at the CT Capitol and also a close friend of John's...

Thoughts of John by Jim O'Brien:

"George Jepsen? You must be kidding! He has accused my boss (the Republican Governor) of every malfeasance known to man," I said. I didn't know much, but I knew John Flanagan was wrong on this - maybe he wasn't so smart after all.

"He is part of the opposition...He's doing his job. I am telling you, he's a great guy. You should meet him. I will introduce you to him," John repeated back to me. Although I had not known John Flanagan very long, I did trust his judgement. And although I knew that Sen. Jepsen was just doing his job, he did not seem like a "good guy." When John introduced us, Sen. Jepsen stuck out his hand and said "don't worry I don't have horns and I don't bite." I quickly came to realize that John was right about Sen. Jepsen.

What I didn't realize at the time was the reason why Sen. Jepsen was so easy to deal with: John had given me his stamp of approval and said I was "okay." Sen. Jepsen and John had been through many political battles together, and once John told Sen. Jepsen I was "okay" - that was all he needed to hear. That was because people liked John, and trusted him. I liked and trusted him.

I first met John sitting in the back row of a municipal law class that met at night. Next to us were PJ Cimini and Mike Renaud, who was John's roommate at the time. After one of our first classes, John invited me to join them at the Spigot, the neighborhood bar -- and a great friendship was born. John had a great way about him - people just liked him. I am not sure what it was. He was very easy to be around. He was smart, funny, and like many Irishmen, a great story teller.

It was not long after I began hanging out with him that we stopped by to see his parents after a pick-up basketball game. We sat and had coffee with them and it was apparent that they were a very close family. His parents were thoughtful, generous and curious. Obviously John had adopted their wonderful traits. We talked for a very long time before John said we had to hit the road. After that one coffee I was invited to family parties and get-togethers, along with many other people the Flanagans had picked up along the way.

The last time I saw John in 2008, we had lunch at a deli across from his office, and the conversation continued afterwards in front of his office. An assistant came out and said a client was on the phone - it was an emergency. A reporter

had called and wanted to know about the client's "green energy policy." "Well, what is their green energy policy?" John said. That was the problem, the assistant said. They didn't have one. "Well, tell the reporter that." The assistant looked surprised and ashen. "I'm only kidding - I will be right in." Relieved, the assistant turned and ran back in the building. With a smile on his face, John turned and said "I'd better go - I have to write up a green energy policy this afternoon."

That was John - irreverent, funny, calm and smart.

Background: When fellow law-school friend Michael Renaud read Jim's piece above, Michael sent this thoughtful and heartwarming email below, and gave us permission to share:

Dear Amanda,

I think of John and those law school days often and it's always with a warm memory of times with you, the law school crew, the great Flanagan family and, of course, John in the center of it all spreading cheer and laughter.

While John was all the things that Jim conveyed in his letter, he also had a big heart. When I first got out of law school, I struggled mightily to find a good job and to make my mark as a lawyer. John was the person I relied on to help me "fake to make it" while I learned to be a lawyer. He thanklessly edited my briefs, provided research on legal issues and offered his tireless moral support.

I can't count how many times he sent me a fax after hours of a marked up brief or some legal research to bail me out. Frankly, I don't know who else I could have turned to help me the way that John did. I was embarrassed to be unskilled and needy but John always gave his time, respect and guidance. He never refused my requests and never made me feel worse for having to ask for help. I haven't found many friends in my life like that and I am very grateful to have had one in John.

I also remember John, you and the Flanagans with a special fondness during the holidays because it was with John and the Flanagan family that I spent my only Thanksgiving without my family at The Flanagan's house in Fairfield. That's not really true - the Flanagans made me part of the family that day. It remains one of my favorite Thanksgiving memories. Like all of us, I miss him greatly.

JPFF Remembers Board Member Father John Baran

JPFF lost one of its founding Board members with the passing of Fr. John Baran on March 24, 2018.

Fr. John was a very close friend and spiritual guide for the Flanagan family and those associated with JPFF. He officiated most weddings and baptisms for the family and presided over John's funeral in 2008.

Fr. John had many gifts that he generously shared with those around him, friends and strangers alike. He was so wonderfully suited for his work as a priest; his mind, heart, sense of humor and compassion were fully utilized for the benefit and comfort of so many individuals and families in our community. And his weekly sermons were incredibly inspiring.

Fr. John Baran was raised in Shelton, graduated from St. Joseph High School in Trumbull, received his Bachelor's of Arts degree from Fairfield University, and his Master's of Divinity degree from St. John's Seminary, Brighton, MA. At the time of his death, he was the Pastor of St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Bridgeport, where he served since 2002.
